"This month, Richland Theatre will be presenting *What the Constitution Means to Me* by Heidi Schreck, September 14, 15, and 16 at 7:00 p.m. and September 17 at 2:00 p.m. in the Shilling Salons. This modern comedy follows Heidi's relationship with the Constitution as she recollects her teenage years traveling the country giving speeches about the US Constitution at American Legion Hall contests to earn money for college. The play explores how rights were won and lost. It covers topics from Dred Scott, to birth control, to Roe v. Wade, to Dirty Dancing. Filled with history and heart, Heidi shares her own family's struggles and triumphs. Where does the responsibility for democracy lie? Constitution is the beginning of a dialog between groups who may not always agree, but who are all bound by the same document.

Francie was a member of Fansfield Neighborhood Association where she served in every capacity. She was on the Executive Committee of CONO, a member of the City's Human Relations Commission, a repeat co-chair of National Night Out, a Dove Staff Member with the Community Services Program, and certainly a one-of-a-kind volunteer. Accepting her award was her husband, Jim.

Along with Francie, Jeanne Mears was also honored and her family members joined the event from Florida and Virginia. Ms. Mears was a strong advocate and volunteer. As a member of Park City, she was determined to make her community a place of choice. She was on the steering committee of National Night Out, and served on the Executive Committee of CONO.

Both women passed away in 2022, but their commitment to our neighborhoods and City of Decatur residents will continue to be remembered as we have renamed the Neighborhood Ambassador Award to the "Johnson-Mears Community Service Award." Their impact will not be soon forgotten!

The "Cooling Season" for Warm Neighbors Cool Friends officially began on September 1. This means that if your income qualifies you can apply for assistance from the program, and payments from the past 45 days will be matched up to \$500. People can apply one time between September 1 and May 31 for this matched assistance. Frequently I will hear from people that they don't want to apply for Warm Neighbors Cool Friends because they don't want to take the assistance away from someone else. But I want to assure you that there is funding for this program, which is provided by the Energy Assistance Foundation. Please apply and please share this information with others! If you have questions on the program, please reach out and I would be happy to talk more about it with you or your group.

Our Monical's Fundraiser for Macon County in July brought in a donation of just under \$225. Again, thank you to those that were able to participate in the fundraiser.

We have been very busy with assisting applicants, which means we are experiencing financial strain. August and September are typically harder months for families financially as there are so many costs related to getting your children back to school. Yes, there are several wonderful events that assist with backpacks

and some school supplies, but that doesn't cover registration fees or some of the higher technology that might be needed for older kids, such as the expensive graphing calculators sometimes needed. If you can donate to Dove Financial Assistance, please know it will be well utilized!

At the end of August, I started a new adventure and am part of the class of 2023 for the Decatur Leadership Institute, DLI! This is a fourteenweek course sponsored by the Decatur Regional Chamber of Commerce in which I will get to learn more about the community and get a "behind the scenes" look. The first session took us to the Culinary Arts Institute at Richland Community College. Here, we got to hear more about the culinary program at Richland and then we were broken up into teams where we had to cook two dishes with the ingredients we were given, very much like the Food Network TV show Chopped! I am looking forward to all the different things I will get to learn about our community by being a part of DLI! I will continue to share my adventures of what I learn and get to do as part of this program.

2023/24 Warm Neighbors Cool Friends Income Requirements & Energy Bill Payment Assistance Guidelines

REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION TO APPLY:

- Driver's License or other Photo LD.
- Copy of current Ameren linos energy bit
- Proof of Income



PROGRAM RULES:

- Applicant(s) must reside at address on bill and have active service in their name
- Applicant can only receive assistance
 ONCE per heating season (September 1 May 31) and ONCE in the cooling season (June 1 August 30)
- •Account balance must be lower than \$1,500
- •WNCF pledges up to \$500 during heating season matching customer payments within the last 45 days
- •Cooling season maximums are \$200 and are intended for seniors, disabled, or those with medical conditions exacerbated by heat (with a doctor's letter)
- •30 Day (GROŚS) Income Range by Family Size

News from Homeward Bound

Staff have been working to engage and house 18 individuals who have been literally homeless (in a shelter, on the streets or somewhere unfit for human occupancy, such as an abandoned building) for 90-days or more.

2 of those individuals meet the chronically homeless criteria, which means they have a diagnosable disability AND have been homeless for at least 1 year or have been homeless 4 times in the past 3 years, totaling 365 days.

There is a total of 186 participants currently receiving housing and/or services.

The need for 1-bedroom units for single individuals is still dire!

Neighborhood Services Program Sharing News About The Neighborhoods

As many already know, National Night Out is the first Tuesday in August every year and this year it appears to have been a huge success in Decatur! Having never experienced NNO before, all I can say is it was so fun, with a sea of faces everywhere. At the debriefing two weeks later, we were told there were more than 600, potentially 650, in attendance. It was awesome to see the Decatur Police Department show up in a big way, including a giant cartoon-like officer dancing and making friends. The Decatur City Staff did an excellent job of keeping the night replenished and moving with all their hard work. It was great to see the Macon Co. Sheriff's Dept. and many, many other amazing volunteers!! All did a fantastic job of serving and promoting peace for our community. Now we rest for a bit then hopefully begin planning next year's fun festival for peace, #NationalNightOut.

At this time of year, we also of course have children returning to school and with that comes Sandy Laesch working hard to schedule and prepare for what sounds like another full year of Beginning Awareness Basic Education Studies, better known as BABES for children K-3rd grades. We are so thankful for all the volunteers who care to participate in this program as well as for a great leader whose heart is to share these

important messages from our puppet friends to area kiddos. Each season, and now beyond into the off seasons, I hear from students whose lives have changed for the better as a result of BABES. This and the messages shared make me so thankful to be a part of a program clearly important to our community children and, in essence, their families.

There are a variety of different kinds of neighborhoods in the Decatur Area and many with different focus, wants and needs. Their approach is impacting, and it speaks to the heart. It's a fellowship of knowing and

being known and seeing those neighbors who attended along the way then becomes different. You've had conversations, you've connected at some level other than a wave and a smile, which of course can go a long way, also. Last year we opened sign ups for toy assistance up by internet/email, but it wasn't as successful or problem free as we had hoped it would be. So, this year we are going to be doing TEN public signups for toy assistance (without food baskets).

If you know someone who may need assistance with Christmas gifts for their kids this year, please let them know the following information:

They must have guardianship of their kids and the kids be living in their household. Parents/guardians will need to bring some sort of photo ID (doesn't have to be a driver's license), as well as proof the kids are in the home. This could be a letter from an agency/school verifying the names of the children in the household, could be a court document stating

the person has guardianship (this is most likely in the case of foster parents), could be medical cards for the children, social security cards, a recent hospital or doctor's bill with the children's names on it, or a printout/screenshot of the Student Demographic/ Profile report from the school. Children must be between the ages of 0 and 17.

If they have already received a referral from their child's school, an agency they're working with, signed up at Northeast Community Fund or Salvation Army, they do not need to sign up again.
