Studies and experience show that
Domestic Violence cases often tend to

stress of children being home on summer
break, lack of activities, increased drug
and alcohol use, increase in the cost of
childcare, the rising cost of cooling bills,
and the hot humid temperatures.

DFA was able to partner with the Energy Assistance Foundation to have an evening of service at the Decatur Public Library. We had a wonderful turnout for this event! While we couldn't qualify everyone that came, we were able to share the resources for assistance that we knew about. If you weren't able to come to the event, but qualify for Warm Neighbors Cool Friends, please make sure to reach out and apply as the program is continuing.

We had a wonderful turnout for our Desserts with Dove (see photo, left) event

in Moultrie County! Making those connections within the community for them to learn more about what services are available in the county will benefit many. While the event only lasted two hours, the affects of it will continue to expand.

As you have probably heard, DFA will be the distributors of covid funding from the City of Decatur. We have until September to utilize up to \$250,000 for qualifying households at a maximum of \$10,000 per household. If you know someone who is a city of

Decatur resident whose income has been affected from covid, please forward them to our website, doveinc.org. We have a pre-

qualifying checklist on the Dove Financial Assistance page to see if you should move forward with completing an application, which is also linked on the website. Please help share the word of this funding so we can assist as many people as possible!



30-Day Residential Income Guidelines
FOR WEATHERIZATION AND BILL PAYMENT ASSISTANCE

Note: Families must show proof of income. A family's monthly gross income must fall between the below ranges, based upon family size, to qualify.

- Driver's License or other Photo I.D. and copy of current Ameren Illinois utility bill
- Applicant must reside at the address on the bill and have active service in his or her name
- Income eligibility, see guidelines, above
- Applicant can receive WNCF assistance only once per heating season, which is 9/1 to 5/31 each year and once per cooling season, 6/1 to 8/31
- WNCF matches customer payments (within the last 45 days) up to \$500 during heating season and up to \$200 during cooling season
- Heating grants are based solely on income guide-lines while cooling grants are intended for seniors, disabled or those with medical conditions exacerbated by heat (with a doctor's letter)

Here is how I sum up BABES volunteers:

V is for their Volunteer commitment to the BABES Program

O is for their Optimism when presenting in the classroom

L is for their Listening and caring about what students share

U is for their Understanding children's needs

N is for the Necessity they are to the students they present to

T is for the Time that they give to BABES

E is for Enthusiasm they bring this program

E is for their positive Engagement with students

R is for being Ready, willing, and able to serve the children in our community!

If you are interested in the opportunity to make a difference in a child's life, we could use your help.

BABES (Beginning Awareness Basic Education Studies) is an imaginative and interactive prevention program which uses colorful hand puppets to teach positive living skills such as dealing with feelings, peer pressure and decision making, coping with situations they can't control, as well as an introduction of drug and alcohol prevention. The material is age appropriate and presented in a factual, non-judgmental manner. Pairs of trained volunteers present six ½ hour lessons in classes Kindergarten through 3rd grade. Scripts are read, there is no need for memorization. Volunteers can choose when and where they present their BABES lessons. This is a great way to make a difference in your community.



At the Tuesday, February 21, 2023 Decatur City Council Meeting, the council approved "Resolution Approving Sub-Recipent Agreement with Dove, Inc. for Rent, Mortgage and Utility Assistance Utilizing CDBG-CV Funds."

Please watch for updates after receiving the final guidelines necessary.

Up to \$250,000 in funds could be distributed by DFA with a maximum of \$10,000 per approved household. This funding is for Decatur residents.

Covid Pre-Checklist

- O Do you live in the city of Decatur?
- Has your income been affected by Covid? This could include any of the following options:
 - · You missed work because you or someone in your household had Covid
 - · You were in quarantine due to Covid and had to miss work
 - . Your place of employment closed due to Covid
 - · Your daycare or school shut down due to Covid
- O Do you meet the Income Requirements? (see website doveinc.org)

If the answer was "YES" to all of the above, move on to the next questions.

- Have you received Covid assistance from the City of Decatur before. This could have been through either Dove, Decatur Township, or Salvation Army?
- O Do you or someone in your household have a conflict of interest between the City of Decatur or Dove, Inc.? This conflict of interest could include:

Being related to an employee, agent, consultant, officer or elected official or appointed official of the City or Dove, Inc., by birth, marriage or adoption and resides within the same household. This would refer specifically to members of the Neighborhood Services Division of the City of Decatur and DFA of Dove, Inc.

If the answer was "NO" to the above two questions, you can move on with getting an application. Applications are available at doveinc.org or a DFA location.

News from Homeward Bound

Staff have been working to engage and house 22 individuals who have been literally homeless (in a shelter, on the streets or somewhere unfit for human occupancy, such as an abandoned building) for 90-days or more. 3 of those individuals meet the chronically homeless criteria, which means they have a diagnosable disability AND have been homeless for at least 1 year or have been homeless 4 times in the past 3 years, totaling 365 days.

There are 195 total participants currently receiving housing and/or services.

The need for 1-bedroom units for single individuals is still dire!

If you're feeling weighed down by the constant barrage of negative news in the media, I have some good news for you. There is still plenty of good happening in our community, and I've seen it firsthand.

Over the last three months, I've had the privilege of visiting Churches and non-profit organizations in the area, and I've been blown away by the impact they're making. A couple weeks ago I visited a place that puts together 288 backpacks full of food for kids in their community who wouldn't otherwise have access to food on the weekend.

Yesterday, I visited an organization that serves as a hangout for kids after school

One of the highlights of my visits was witnessing the Good Samaritan Inn in action. With the help of dedicated volunteers, they were able to feed over 100 people in just 90 minutes! What an encouragement and inspiration leaving that day!

At the Mt. Zion Food Pantry, I spoke to people who rely on their services, and it was heartwarming to hear how much it means to them. And the volunteers who run the pantry were clearly passionate about their work and the difference they're making in the community; you could see it in the smile on their faces.
