2023/24 Warm Neighbors Cool Friends Income Requirements & Energy Bill Payment Assistance Guidelines

REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION TO APPLY:

- Driver's License or other Photo LD.
- Copy of current Ameren linois energy bit
- Proof of Income



PROGRAM RULES:

- Applicant(s) must reside at address on bill and have active service in their name
- Applicant can only receive assistance
 ONCE per heating season (March 1
 May 31) and ONCE in the cooling
- •Account balance must be lower than \$1,500

season (June 1 – August 30)

- •WNCF pledges up to \$500 during heating season matching customer payments within the last 45 days
- •Cooling season maximums are \$200 and are intended for seniors, disabled, or those with medical conditions exacerbated by heat (with a doctor's letter)
- •30 Day (GROŚS) Income Range by Family Size

Are you 55 or better and want to help support Dove?

Are you interested in volunteering in the community - or are you already volunteering?

If you answered yes to both questions, there's a simple way to support one of our programs and that's by enrolling in the Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP). By filling out a simple enrollment form, we can help you match your interests and skills with one of the non-profits or agencies that we work with to place volunteers.

If you want to help feed people facing food insecurity, we work with numerous food pantries, Good Samaritan Inn, Meals on Wheels, and Peace Meals. If you want to help make sure homebound seniors receive visits to help reduce their social isolation or provide transportation for them to doctors' appointments, we can help link you with agencies that provide those services who are in need of volunteers. If you have an interest in doing your volunteering outdoors, we have places that need volunteers for things like gardening, conservation, and general upkeep. Hospitals, libraries, museums, clothing rooms, tax preparation, advocacy, disaster work and preparation, general office work. These are just some of the available options. There is truly something for everyone. We currently have 52 places where our volunteers are needed between Macon and DeWitt counties.

Schedules are often flexible, and you can volunteer as often or as little as you want. There are even things you can do from the comfort of your own home, such as knitting, crocheting, sewing, making, and addressing cards, writing letters, etc.

All you must do is track the hours you spend volunteering and turn them in to us. Doing this enables us to report to our funders all the amazing things that our senior volunteers do for our communities, something that is so often overlooked. It also earns you an invitation to our appreciation events and a copy of our bi-monthly newsletter, provides you with secondary insurance in case of accidents while volunteering, and you are almost guaranteed to make new friends.

If you are a church that is a Dove supporter, we would love to come speak to you about opportunities that are available to any of your 55 and better groups! If your church or agency wants to help support Dove and you have a food pantry that serves people in Macon or De-Witt Counties, getting any of your volunteers who are already volunteering to enroll in RSVP is another great way to help support our

program, and if you're in need of more volunteers, we could add you to our list of places that will accept volunteers.
