As we plan for the months ahead, Coats for Kids serves as a reminder of what makes Decatur special—neighbors helping neighbors, all working together to make sure no child is left out in the cold.

### **Domestic Violence Program**

Summer is a period of transition for the Domestic Violence Program. The 2025 fiscal funding year is complete and FY26 began on July 1. The program is immersed in final reporting for FY25 and staff members are adjusting to new requirements for FY26 from our funders. A time-consuming and vital component of all social service work is weekly documentation of services and quarterly reporting of all services to the program's major funders. Advocates document their services in 15-minute increments; those services are entered into the InfoNet database, and the Program Director and Dove Finance Team use those data in reporting to funders. The Domestic Violence Program's funders are: Federal - Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) and Violence Against Women Act (VAWA); State/Federal – Illinois Department of Human Services and Illinois Attorney General; Local – Macon County Mental Health Board and DeWitt County Mental Health Board. The program also receives supportive donations from local agencies, foundations, and private donors. All of these donors and funding fit into an intricate network that supports the services of the Domestic Violence Program.

Amid the behind-the-scenes work of program support, the real work of the Domestic Violence Program goes on daily. The shelter remains at capacity – as soon as one family moves out into their new housing, their room is occupied by a new survivor seeking services. Legal advocates are in court daily, supporting individuals seeking Orders of Protection. Advocates are providing individualized services, emergency shelter, counseling, advocacy, referrals for housing and other services, support groups, transportation, and emotional support. Our county coordinators provide comprehensive assistance for local needs, such as Orders of Protection, counseling, advocacy, referrals, food and housing assistance, and transportation. The program's outreach team provides presentations at community events, to local agencies, and to students on domestic violence and how to access Dove's services. Currently, our outreach and children's staff are helping families prepare for the upcoming school year, while they begin scheduling educational presentations for the new semester.

The focus of all the Domestic Violence Program's efforts – the visible services and the behind-the-scenes work – is to provide a haven of safety, healing, solutions, and growth for survivors and their families who are fleeing domestic violence.

There's a word we use a lot when talking about heroes: service. It means standing up, even when it's hard. It means choosing to help others, even when no one's watching. And sometimes... it means asking for help, too. I've been privileged to serve with Dove, Inc. for 21 years, since August of 2004. I've worked in the domestic violence shelter, in the neighborhood services program, helped organize holiday drives, comforted survivors, and coordinated volunteers across counties. I've seen firsthand the way this organization changes lives.

Dove has been a cornerstone of Central Illinois since the 1970s—quietly, consistently doing the hard work that holds a community together. You may not always see it, but it's there:

- Helping a mom and her kids escape domestic violence through our domestic violence shelter and the Homeward Bound program
- Keeping heat on in the winter and groceries on the table through Dove Financial Assistance and DeWitt County's food pantry.
- Providing warm coats to kids who need them, outfits for families through the Children's Clothing Room, and gifts and meals through Christmas Care and Share.
- Guiding children through BABES so they learn empathy and healthy choices.
- Placing senior volunteers through RSVP, connecting wisdom and experience with purpose and impact.

All of this happens because people like you care. But right now, we're facing hard questions. Program funding is shrinking. Federal grants are in jeopardy. And while Dove is not on the brink of closing, we are at risk of significant cuts in coming months. That means fewer services. Fewer people helped.

That's why I'm writing you today—not as a program director, but as a person who cares, and who is concerned about what's coming. As someone who has given their heart to this work. I'm asking you to stand with us, to keep the mission strong.

## Homeward Bound

### **Coordinated Entry**

Staff have been working to engage and house 33 individuals who have been literally homeless (in a shelter, transitional housing, on the streets, or somewhere unfit for human occupancy, such as an abandoned building) for 90 days or more. 4 of those individuals meet the chronically homeless criteria, which means they have a diagnosable disability AND have been homeless for at least 1 year or have been homeless 4 times in the past 3 years, totaling 365 days.

There are 146 total participants currently receiving housing and/or services.

#### **Macon County Continuum of Care**

Dove-Homeward Bound, on behalf of the Macon County CoC, continues to provide services and has staff available 24 hours a day to assist those in need of housing solutions.
